Financial Supports for those Affected by COVID-19

What is the BC-Temporary Rental Supplement (BC-TRS) Program?

- Temporary supplement to assist eligible low- and moderate-income renters who are struggling to pay their rent as a result of COVID-19.
- Up to \$500 paid directly to landlord depending on various factors
- Applications open mid-April. Tenants and landlords each need to submit an application

Laid off?

- Apply for regular EI benefits
- Need between 420 and 700 hours of insurable employment based on unemployment rate in your area
- If became eligible for EI on March 15th or later, claim will be processed through Canada Emergency Response Benefit. (CERB)
- 1 week waiting period in which you will not be paid

In self-quarantine & unable to work?

- Apply for EI Sickness Benefits
- 1 week waiting period has been waived
- Need at least 600 hours of insurable earnings in past 52 weeks
- If became eligible for EI benefits on March 15th or later, claim will be processed through Canada Emergency Response Benefit. (CERB)
- You will not have to provide a medical certificate

What is the Canada Emergency Response Benefit (CERB)?

- Taxable benefit of \$500 a week for up to 16 weeks for:
 - *Workers who must stop working* due to COVID19 and do not have access to paid leave or other income support.
 - o *Workers who are sick, quarantined, or taking care of someone* who is sick with COVID 19.
 - *Working parents* who must stay home without pay to care for children that are sick or need additional care because of school and daycare closures.
 - Workers who still have their employment but are not being paid because there is currently not sufficient work and their employer has asked them not to come to work.
 - *Wage earners and self-employed individuals*, including contract workers, who would not otherwise be eligible for Employment Insurance.
- Need an income of at least \$5,000 in 2019 or in 12 months prior to date of application
- If became eligible for EI regular or sickness benefits prior to March 15th, your claim will be processed under pre-existing EI rules

Do I qualify for WorkSafe BC Benefits?

- WorkSafe BC benefits are not for preventative measures or non-work related exposures
- Only file a claim for COVID-19 if it was contracted through a work-related exposure
